

Drug Disposal Tips

Deterra bags are designed to deactivate and dispose of unused medications safely, providing an environmentally friendly solution to prevent substance misuse and protect water sources from contamination.

Locate **Deterra bags** in your community by visiting local health departments, pharmacies, hospitals, or contacting healthcare providers.



Prevention is key!

Prevent youth from accessing prescription drugs by disposing of them regularly.



DISPOSE OF USED SYRINGES SAFELY!

- If you do not have a sharps container, put them inside of a heavy gauge plastic bottle such as a laundry detergent bottle.
- Put the cap on and tape it onto the bottle.
- The bottle can then be disposed of in the garbage.
- This will lessen the likelihood of someone being accidentally stuck or causing septic issues.

Syringes should NOT be disposed in Drug Take Back Boxes or flushed down the toilet.

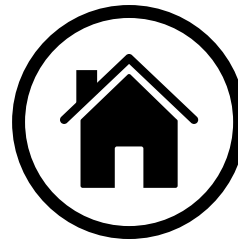

Reduce the stigma around substance use by being conscious of your language

Terms to use when discussing SUD	
Instead of...	Use...
Addict	Person with a substance use disorder
Substance Abuse	Substance (Mis)use
Drug of choice	Drug of use
Medicated Assisted Treatment	Treatment
Recovering addict	Person in recovery

The National Institute of Mental Health (NIMH) defines a substance use disorder (SUD) as a mental disorder that affects a person's brain and behavior, leading to the inability to control their use of substances such as legal or illegal drugs, alcohol, or medications.
